## Mountain Uhud

(10–15 min)

The mountain stands as a silent witness to sacrifice, courage, and faith. The Prophet Muhammad (ﷺ) said, "Uhud loves us, and we love Uhud."

## Shuhada Uhud Cemetery

(10–15 min)

Located at the base of Mountain Uhud, this cemetery is the resting place of the martyrs of the Battle of Uhud, including the Prophet's beloved uncle, Hamza ibn Abdul Muttalib (RA). Visiting here is a reminder of the sacrifices made to preserve Islam.

## Mount Rumah

(Pass By)

Mount Rumah, or the Archer's Hill, played a crucial role in the Battle of Uhud. This is where the Prophet (ﷺ) positioned archers to protect the Muslims' rear flank. Its story serves as a lesson on discipline and obedience.

## Masjid Al-Qiblatayn

(20–25 min)

Masjid Al-Qiblatayn, meaning "The Mosque of the Two Qiblahs," is where the direction of prayer was divinely changed from Masjid Al-Aqsa in Jerusalem to the Kaaba in Makkah. It remains a place of deep historical and spiritual significance.

## Masjid Al-Jumma

(Pass By)

This mosque marks the location where the Prophet Muhammad (ﷺ) led his first Friday (Jumma) prayer after migrating to Madinah. It is a cherished spot for visitors to pass and reflect upon.

## Saba Masajid

(15 min)

The Saba Masajid, or Seven Mosques, is a collection of historic mosques located at the site of the Battle of the Trench (Khandaq). Each mosque represents a different part of the battle's history and the steadfastness of the Muslim army.

## **Khandaq Battlefield**

(Pass By)

The site of the famous Battle of the Trench, where the Muslims dug a defensive trench around Madinah to protect it from invading forces. This strategic move, advised by Salman Farsi (RA), led to a decisive defense of the city.

## Garden of Salman

**Farsi**

(15 min)

This lush garden belonged to Salman Farsi (RA), a companion of the Prophet (ﷺ) who suggested the trench strategy. It is a peaceful spot and a reminder of his wisdom and service to Islam.

## Masjid Quba

(20–25 min)

Masjid Quba holds the honor of being the first mosque built by the Prophet Muhammad (ﷺ) after his migration to Madinah. Performing two rak'ahs of prayer here is said to be equivalent in reward to an Umrah.

## Ghars Well

(Pass By)

Ghars Well is a historic water source in Madinah, closely linked to the life of the Prophet (ﷺ). It is said that he drank from this well, adding to its spiritual significance.
